No matter how much experience you have, it's always a good idea for everyone to review boating safety rules before departures. Here are 10 basic boating safety tips to help you stay safe:

- 1. Be Weather-Wise
- 2. Follow a Pre-Departure Checklist
- 3. Use Common Sense
- 4. Designate an Assistant Skipper
- 5. Develop a Float Plan
- 6. Make Proper Use of Lifejackets
- 7. Avoid Alcohol
- 8. Learn to Swim
- 9. Take a Boating Course
- 10. Consider a Free Vessel Safety Check

This month: #1. Be Weather-Wise: Always check local weather conditions before departure. TV, radio, and marine forecasts can be a good source of information. If you notice darkening clouds, volatile and rough changing winds or sudden drops in temperature, Wait! Play it safe by staying at the dock or getting to safe moorage ASAP.

BVYC's Marine Shop and Swap


Wanted:

Reciprocal Basics

"Yacht club reciprocity" may be defined as "a network of yacht clubs in agreement for the mutual exchange of privileges within that specific group of clubs." Brownsville Yacht Club has reciprocal privilege agreements with over 95 Yacht Clubs throughout Puget Sound and beyond. Although the extent of privileges may vary, generally a Brownsville Yacht Club member can expect to be allowed to use all of the welcoming clubs' available facilities and services, including short term berthing, meal and bar service, heads and showers, etc. Typically, a yacht club member can stop at a yacht club along his way, and if this club has a reciprocity agreement with the member's club and there is room, he is welcome to stay.

Some clubs charge for the first night's berthing, others do not, and it seldom matters whether you come by boat or car. Some yacht clubs limit their reciprocal privileges to those coming by boat. It is always a good idea to call ahead to let them know you're coming, as well as to determine what services are available. The visitor must settle all personal charges and bills with the visited yacht club before departing.

Wendy's Cherry Squares

From the files of Wendy Kalskett...

1 cup butter, softened

1 3/4 cup sugar

1/2 tsp almond flavoring

1/2 tsp vanilla

4 eggs

1/4 tsp salt

3 cups flour

1 can or jar cherry pie filling (or fruit pie filling of choice)

Icing:

1 1/2 cup powdered sugar

2 tbls butter, softened

1/2 tsp vanilla

1/2 tsp almond flavoring

Dash of salt

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350. Mix butter, sugar, and flavorings, and add in eggs, one at a time. Stir in salt and flour. Spread half the batter onto a cookie sheet lined with parchment paper, and evenly spread pie filling over batter. Top with remaining batter (this is more like "plopping" spoonfuls of batter on top of filling and doing one's best to sort of spread around). Bake 25-30 minutes. When cool, drizzle with icing, cut into squares and serve.
